## About the exhibition:

Joan Arbeiter is a feminist, painter, author, curator, and educator. Her collection is comprised of twelve portraits of female artists from the book she co-authored, <u>Lives and Works: Talks with Women</u> <u>Artists</u>. Arbeiter utilizes watercolors overlaid with dry media on textured clayboard. Her use of fabric, glitter, unique patterns and backgrounds for each portrait reflects the feminist art of her time. Arbeiter's customized framing conveys the personality each woman encompasses. In addition, every artist added to the portrait with a personal message onto the canvas.






