Glossary

Calypso: a type of folk song primarily from Trinidad though sung elsewhere in the southern and eastern Caribbean islands. (Source: <u>https://www.britannica.com/art/calypso-music</u>)

Soca: Trinidadian popular music that developed in the 1970s and is closely related to calypso. Used for dancing at Carnival and at fetes, soca emphasizes rhythmic energy and studio production. (Source: <u>https://www.britannica.com/art/soca-music</u>)

Reggae: A style of popular music that originated in Jamaica in the late 1960s and quickly emerged as the country's dominant music. (Source: <u>https://www.britannica.com/art/reggae</u>)
