Nick St. Clair was born in 1994 in Northeast Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and at the age of two, St. Clair was diagnosed with autism. He grew up watching cartoons after school and this is what started his passion for drawing and animation. At the age of 12, Nick St. Clair found that he was able to express himself through creating characters, cartoons, and animation flipbooks. Showing his classmates his drawings helped him to develop confidence and make friends. Despite any struggles, St. Clair kept with drawing all throughout middle school and high school, learning skills and confidence.

Nick St. Clair recognized the importance of helping others and promoting autism awareness. His works of art reveal his passion and hopes to inspire others with autism. Each poster that St. Clair creates is hand drawn and colored with a logo at the center and puzzle pieces in the background, representing the national symbol of autism. The colors he uses correspond with the logo or brand's colors.
