



Programming Spotlights

Top Row (left to right):

1. SatARTDays, Class held every Saturday from April 3 - May 8, 2022. Free children's art classes held for Atlantic City residents at the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University, Atlantic City, NJ. Six week series each spring and fall instructed by local teachers covering various materials and disciplines.
2. Monthly Second Fridays and Third Thursdays. Monthly exhibition receptions that are free and open-to-the-public at the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University in Atlantic City and Stockton University Kramer Hall in Hammonton. Live music, pop-up vendors, and refreshments are offered.
3. Life Drawing, Public class held twice a month on the first and third Thursday of each month in partnership with Art Club Hammonton, \$5.00 per attendee to cover cost of model, virtual and in-person applications, focus on figure drawing.
4. Black Art Matters, monthly free programming in partnership with Raymond Tyler who is a highly regarded local radio personality and community influencer of the Arts, free programming, unique monthly themes to inspire artists and discussions about their work, open forum discussions encouraged.

5. Free Noyes Art Classes at Boys and Girls Club, free art classes held at the Boys and Girls Club of Atlantic City for the Kids' and Teens' programs. Classes were taught virtually and in-person by local artists and art teachers.
6. Noyes Summer Art Camp, held yearly at Stockton University's Art Gallery in Galloway, NJ, summer camp runs for three weeks total, weekly curriculum is created based on themes encouraging education across several disciplines, open to the public with fees based on week.
7. Ducktown Community Garden (Art in the Garden/Educational Garden Programming), presented in partnership with Ducktown Neighborhood Association and maintained by the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University staff and volunteers, produce produced includes herbs and vegetables inspired by the diverse, multicultural demographic of the Ducktown neighborhood the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University is in.

8. World Above, free monthly programming presented in partnership with the Murphy Writing Center and South Jersey Poets, open forum event encouraging poets to present their work inspired by a monthly prompt, includes guest speakers each month.

9. SCOSA Second Wednesdays, free public program held monthly in partnership with Stockton Center Of Successful Aging presenting a craft, held at the Noyes Galleries at Kramer Hall.

10. "Growing American: The Alliance Agricultural Colony in South Jersey" exhibition programming. Golden Baby dramatic reading, guided tours, virtual historical interviews and footage (*Conversations About Norma, Alliance & Brotmanville* Video: *Picnic Days about Vineland with Buddy Bardfeld*). Virtual and in-person programming at Stockton University Kramer Hall in Hammonton, October 1 - February 4)

11. The Art of Doing, presented in partnership with Atlantic City Theatre Corporation, series of five to six classes held seasonally free and open to the public, two hour classes.

12. Ducktown Mural, created by local artist Susan Daly on the wall of Barbera's Seafood Market, commissioned by Ducktown Neighborhood Association.

13. Atlantic City Holiday Bazaar, December 4 and 5, 2021 at the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University, Arts and crafts bazaar organized in partnership with Asbury Park Bazaar which featured over 30 local vendors, an indoor biergarten with Cape May Brewery, and non-stop live music.

JEVS, partnership with JEVS Human Services of Atlantic County providing work experience for individuals with cognitive and developmental disabilities, expanding to provide opportunities for individuals in their NJYC program starting April 2022, Gabe (pictured) has volunteered with the Noyes Arts Garage of Stockton University since July 2021 to now (April 2022).
